Communication & Language

We will be focussing on developing speaking and listening skills, taking turns in conversation, joining words to speak in sentences, responding verbally to questions and following instructions.

We will be introduced to lots of new words as we extend our language. We will practice using manners in daily conversation.

Physical Development

We will be concentrating on personal and self care skills, supporting the children to toilet themselves, and wash and dry their hands independently. They will be learning how to put on and take off their outdoor clothes and use fastenings. We will also focus on moving safely and appropriately both indoors and outside and recognising our own and other's personal space.

Literacy

We will develop our focus and concentration skills by listening to stories. We will share lots of rhymes and develop our listening skills by tuning into different sounds that we hear. We will also learn letter sounds and to read, create story maps, create secret messages and write some letters, words and our names.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be settling into our new classrooms and getting to learn lots of new names! We will take time to get to know each other well and to feel safe and secure in our new settings. The children will be supported to follow our routines, express their needs verbally. We will encourage children to talk about their interests and their family members. We will learn how to be independent, finding and putting away our toys and equipment, sharing our ideas and turn taking during play.



Reception Autumn Term 2022 Learning Journey

Come and See

We begin our term with our 'Myself' topic, where we will be thinking about our name and why it is so special. We invite you to contribute to your child's learning by telling us about their first name and why it was chosen for them. We continue with 'Welcome', a unit that helps us think about Baptism and the welcome babies have to the Catholic family and church.

Mathematics

Our focus will be recognising key times of day, and learning our class routines. We will be exploring the continuous provision inside and out, matching and sorting things and remembering where things belong. We will also enjoy number rhymes and songs, looking closely at amounts of things, learning to subitise (recognise amounts without counting) recognise & find numbers in and around our environment.

Understanding the World

We will be thinking about ourselves and our families in our Come and See religious education unit.

We will also look at how we have changed and grown since we were babies.

We will continue to work and develop our skills using lots of technology, including iPads, cameras and beebots. We will be looking at the weather and changes of the seasons.

Expressive Art and Design

We will be creating self-portraits using a range of media including taking selfies using ICT. We will be continuing our musical development through listening and responding to songs, nursery rhymes and instruments. We also will create dens inside and outdoors using natural materials.
