

<p><b><u>Communication, Language and Literacy</u></b></p> <p>We will listen to and learn stories and rhymes featuring well known fairy tale characters and joining in and acting out the stories we have enjoyed. Through adult modelling, children will be encouraged to actively listen and where appropriate, develop their use of questioning when communicating with others.</p>	<p><b><u>Expressive Art and Design</u></b></p> <p>This term, children will extend upon their role play experiences through our garden centre &amp; pizza parlour/food delivery themed role play and creative activities.</p> <p>We encourage children to follow and express their own interests including expressing themselves creatively in whichever medium they choose. This could be role play, through drawing, painting, collage, junk modelling, making music, songs, rhymes and movement and dance.</p>	<p><b><u>Mathematics</u></b></p> <p>The children will continue to explore numbers up to 10 and beyond in depth by developing a solid understanding of number and number bonds within 10. We will be using our journals to record our mathematical thinking and understanding as well as applying maths in our daily routines such as counting objects, actions and people. Children will also begin to explore the concept of odd/even, doubles and repeating patterns.</p>
<p><b><u>Physical Development</u></b></p> <p>Our focus this term will be to strengthen our bodies and develop our control and stamina via our swimming sessions and co-ordination through dance and ball skills.</p> <p>We will continue to build dexterity and strength through finger challenges and refine our letter formation and pencil control.</p>	<div data-bbox="1055 639 1272 839" data-label="Image"> </div> <p><b>Reception Summer Term 2023 Learning Journey</b></p>	<p><b><u>Understanding the World</u></b></p> <p>We will be focussing on our physical and mental health, learning about healthy food, exploring where food comes from and how we can prepare and cook it using utensils and technology.</p> <p>We will look closely at the changing weather and seasons and develop a sense of growth and change over time.</p>
<p><b><u>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</u></b></p> <p>Children will be supported to develop empathy and begin to take others ideas into consideration and show sensitivity to others needs and feelings. We will continue to develop positive relationships with the adults and their peers and have an understanding that not everyone likes the same things and that everybody's talents should be valued and celebrated.</p>	<p><b><u>Literacy</u></b></p> <p>As part of our Read to Write approach we continue developing our skills in story mapping, learning and using new vocabulary and writing our own version of Little Red Riding Hood. We will also focus on non-fiction books about plants and recipes.</p> <p>Our phonics sessions will develop our fluency when blending and reading and show we have understood what we have read by discussing stories, instructions and captions.</p>	<p><b><u>Come and See</u></b></p> <p>In our RE sessions, we will focus on <b>Friendships</b> and how we can forgive when things go wrong. We will learn that Jesus had special friends and that Jesus' message to us was 'to love one another.' We will also learn about how special <b>Our World</b> is and give thanks for it. We will discuss all the things we love about our world and the different ways in which we can take care of it and all those who live in it.</p>
