OVERVIEW

- Works with external agencies including Children's Services and the National Health Service to identify and respond to concerns
- Provides support for children experiencing loss through our partnership with Twin Vision
- Has achieved the Healthy Schools Awards
- Identifies and resources relevant professional development
- Resources PSHE and whole school, Key Stage, Year Group and class enrichment activities

RESOURCES

Funding for PSHE resources and enrichment activities are met from the General Budget line and through the Home School Association.

OUTCOMES

All children have age appropriate knowledge and understanding with regards to emotional health and well-being and feel confident and supported with respect to their rights and responsibilities and their ability to make positive choices.
