Willow class

P.E –

Year 2 will be focusing on invasion games. The children will be learning how to control a ball with hand, foot and different pieces of equipment. This theme allows opportunities for the children to reflect upon their roles and responsibilities in their world. They will develop an understanding of rewards and consequences and how

History –

This term our history will be focused around the Great Fire of London. We will investigate how, why and where this fire started. The children will be learning to chronologically sequence events that happened, and identify reasons why so many buildings were burned down in the catastrophe. They will make comparisons between how the fire was dealt with then, and how different this would have been today.

Mathematics

We have had a wonderful start and have been studying place value (tens and ones) in Maths and have also been partitioning 2 digit numbers. The children will be ordering and comparing numbers using appropriate symbols and sentence stems. They will use concrete, pictorial and abstract representations to prove their understanding. Once children have mastered our place value objectives, we will then move to addition and subtraction. The children will add

English

The children will be exploring the text The Night Gardener by The Fan Brothers, This fantastic text will allow children to expand their vocabulary and sentence accuracy. Children will become immersed in the magic of Grimloch Park filled with unusual sculptures! Our children will be exploring setting descriptions throughout this unit, After this, the children will explore and create diary entries and non-chronological reports. This term the children will continue to be taught phonics through daily Read, Write Inc lessons. We will develop our comprehension skills through weekly focused lessons. In addition to this, we will continue to carry out our daily guided reading sessions. We will have a focus on spelling and handwriting this term. The children will learn to

Science

This term's topic is Materials. The children will begin by distinguishing between an object and the material from which it is made. They should be able to identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal and rock. Children will adopt an investigative approach, describing the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday items. We will also identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.

Things you can do with your child at home:

Reading with your child every day is very important and will have a positive impact on their education. Listen to your child read regularly at home and please sign their reading record, remember that you can record any type of reading in it not just their reading book (For example, iPad apps, magazines etc.). The aim is to create a love of reading for your child and any form of reading will be beneficial to them. **Please ensure your child's book is in every day.** When you are reading with your child, ask them questions about what they have read: who was their favourite character? Can they predict what might happen in the next story? Your involvement in your child's reading will have the greatest impact on their progress.

Practise counting with your child every day. By the end of Year Two children must count in 2s, 3s, 5s, 10s.
