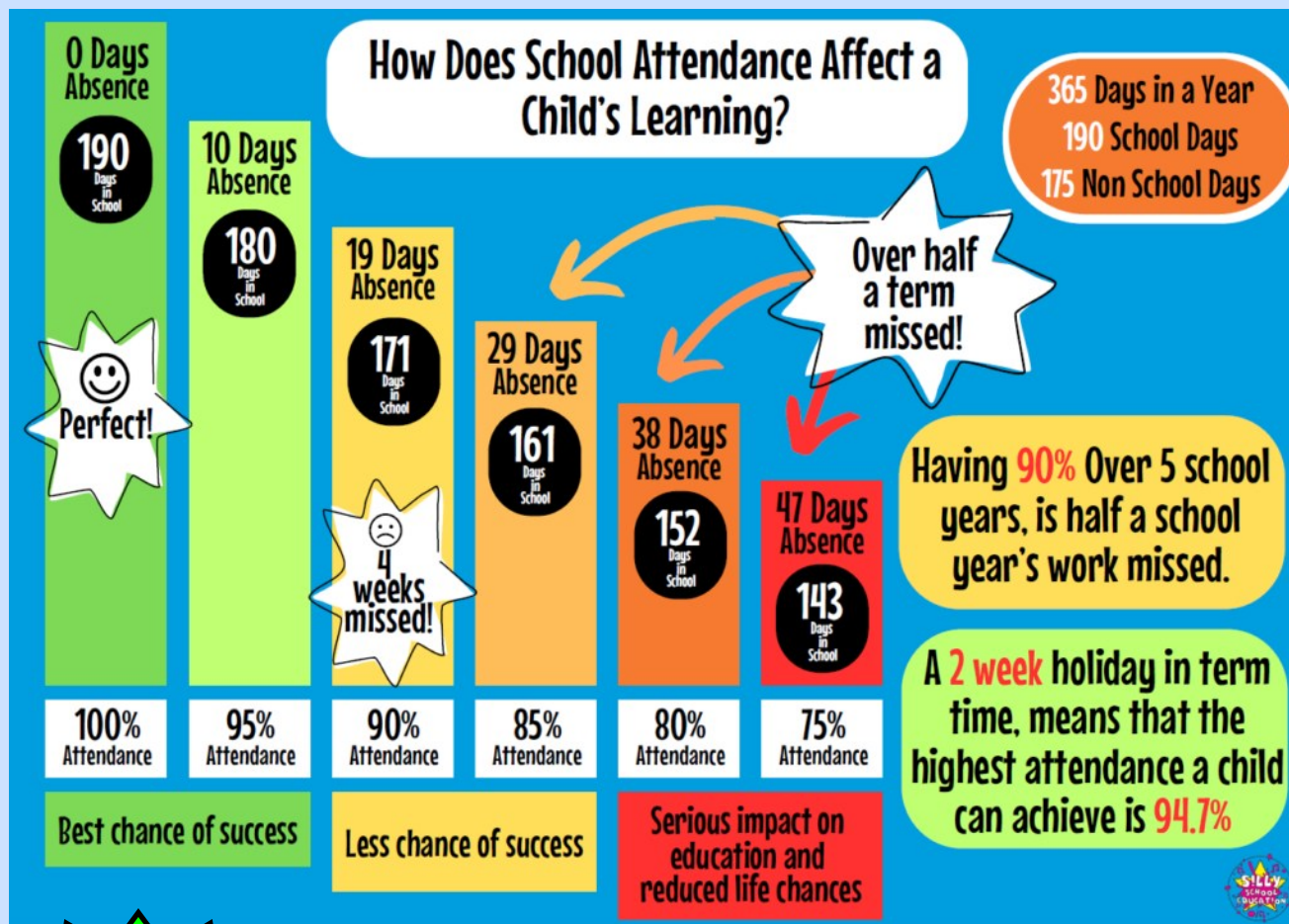

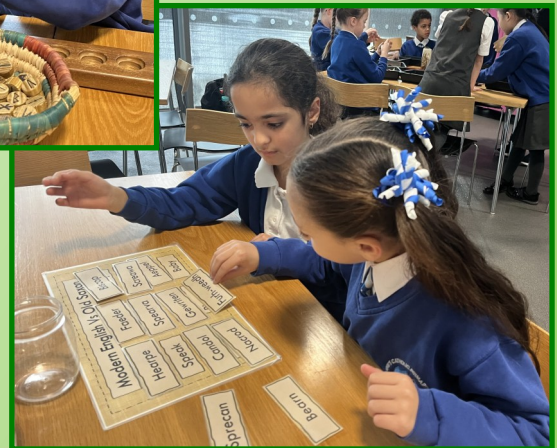
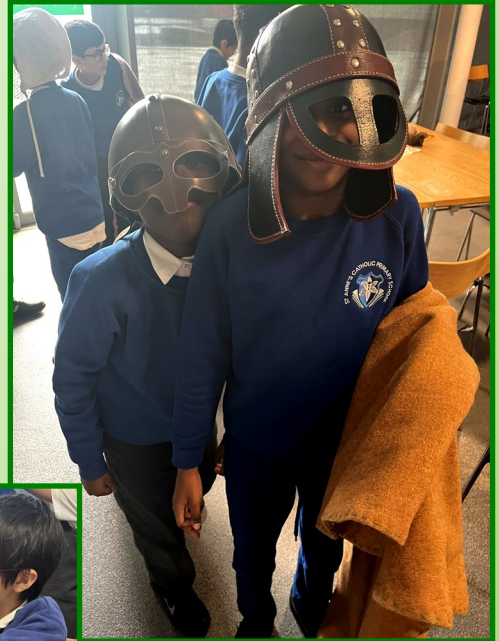

# Catholic Life Every Day

As we begin the season of Advent, we enter a time of waiting and getting ready for the birth of Jesus at Christmas. Advent lasts for the four Sundays before Christmas and reminds us to

pause, reflect and prepare our hearts for Jesus — not just to rush around planning presents, shopping and parties, but to focus on what Christmas truly means.

The Advent wreath helps us mark each week of this special season. The evergreen circle reminds us of God's endless love. There are four candles: three purple candles for hope, peace and love, and one pink candle for joy.

Each Sunday we light one more candle, bringing more light into the darkness as we move closer to Christmas Day, when we light the white candle in the centre to celebrate Jesus' birth.

The Advent wreath is a simple, beautiful sign that Christmas is coming — and that Advent is our time to prepare our hearts for Jesus, the Light of the World.
