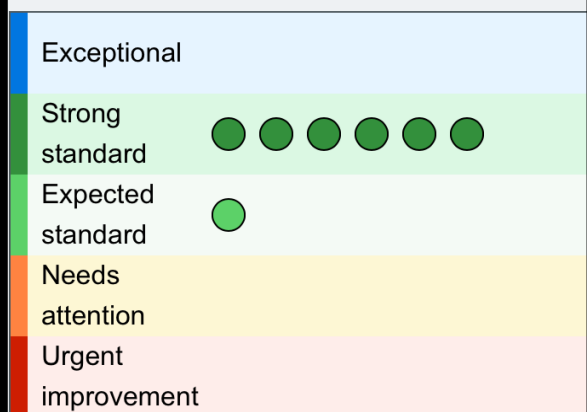

Recent Ofsted Inspection

The report recognises that St Anne's Catholic Primary School is providing a strong standard of education.

- Children feel safe, known and valued.

- An ambitious and well-sequenced curriculum that helps pupils build knowledge over time.

- A highly inclusive approach where every child is supported to succeed, regardless of their starting point.
 - A strong focus on personal development, wellbeing and safeguarding, ensuring pupils feel safe, valued and cared for.

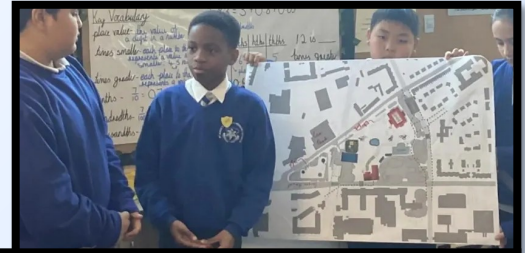

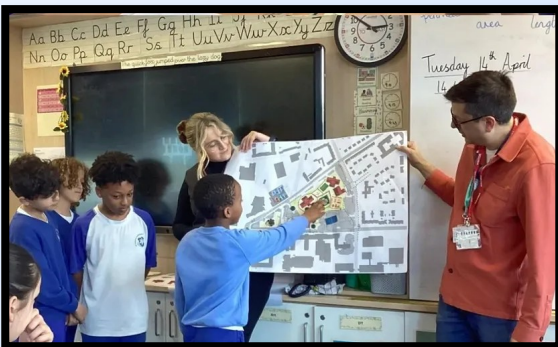
